Our Appetite Director will oversee all aspects of the programme including planning, producing and leading the staff team. They will join the New Vic Theatre Leadership Team and contribute to overall strategy for both the Appetite programme and for the theatre.

Our ideal candidate will be an ambitious creative producer who is looking for a leadership role. Someone who has experience of programming and producing and is excited by the idea of working closely with our local communities.

About Appetite

Appetite is part of Arts Council England's Creative People and Places programme, which aims to increase engagement in the arts in areas where participation has traditionally been lower.

Working across Stoke-on-Trent and Newcastle-under-Lyme. Appetite is led by the New Vic Theatre in partnership with a consortium of local organisations - Partners in Creative Learning, 6Towns Radio, University of Staffordshire, Go Kidsgrove, Keele University, and Newcastle-under-Lyme Business Improvement District.

Appetite is a small staff team, all based at the New Vic. led by the Director with support from the Appetite General Manager.

Appetite's innovative approach and community focus have made it a key contributor to the cultural and social vitality of Stoke-on-Trent and Newcastle-under-Lyme.

The programme

Since its launch in 2013, Appetite has developed a wide range of artistic projects - including large scale outdoor circus spectacles; immersive art installations; a large-scale light night; empty shops transformed into creative hubs; open air galleries.

Volunteers are key to the programme, and so are our delivery partners, who currently include Business Improvement District, Canal and River Trust, Middleport Matters.

The current programme includes:

Supper Club

Local residents work year-round in collaboration with the Appetite team to curate, plan and produce the programme, putting community decision-making at the heart of our work.

The Big Feast

A two-day summer festival on the streets of Stoke-on-Trent, bringing national and international artists and arts organizations to our streets, parks and shopping centres.

Sensasian

A celebration of South Asian Heritage which takes over the New Vic building every year

The New Vic is unique. The first purpose-built theatre-in-theround in Europe and a ground-breaker in the integration of professional theatre-work with an extensive community and education programme, we make theatre that is valued by local audiences and recognised nationally and internationally.

We believe in the power of theatre to change lives. We also believe that everyone should have access to great theatre and on average 180,000 people visit the New Vic each year.

The New Vic has forged a national reputation for producing first class theatre. We have a full in-house creative team, including costume, scenic workshops, lighting, sound and design.

Our extensive community and education programmes reach over 25,000 people annually, with award-winning New Vic Borderlines, and New Vic Education departments ensuring we are key to the cultural life of the region. Alongside this the theatre leads Appetite, an Arts Council England Creative People & Places programme, to engage more people in Stoke-on-Trent and North Staffordshire in the arts.

The New Vic is a registered charity with a turnover of £5 million and operates thanks to a unique partnership between Arts Council England, Newcastle-under-Lyme Borough Council and Staffordshire County Council.

Appetite Director employment details

Contract

This post of Appetite Director is offered on a full-time, permanent contract of 40 hours per week. However, the option to work flexibly between 30-40 hours will be considered, depending on the candidate and agreement about job description priorities.

Salary

The salary for the post at 40 hours is £48,743-£50,000 per annum. The salary will be pro rata if less than 40 hours per week.

Work Location

The role requires a deep commitment to being actively engaged with the communities of Stoke-on-Trent and Newcastle-under-Lyme.

Hours of work

Hours are to be worked flexibly on the understanding that the delivery of projects will require evening and weekend working. All New Vic employees are expected to work some evenings and Saturdays if required. Any hours in addition to your normal hours are to be agreed in advance with your manager. In certain circumstances you may be asked to work on Sundays and Bank Holidays.

Holiday Entitlement

This holiday entitlement for this post is 25 days plus bank holidays. The holiday year runs from 1 April to 31 March.

Probationary & Notice Period

The probationary period for this post is six months. The notice period during the probationary period is four weeks. Following successful completion of the probationary period the notice period is 12 weeks.

General

All eligible staff are automatically opted in for the New Vic's basic pension scheme under auto enrolment legislation. All offers of employment are subject to the candidate being able to provide suitable proof of their eligibility to work in the UK, references, and an an enhanced DBS check.

Appetite Director Job Description

Principle purpose

Lead on strategy and delivery to meet the aims and objectives of the Creative People and Places programme for Stoke-on-Trent and Newcastle-under-Lyme.

As Lead Officer and overall Director:

- Lead the programme staff and freelance team members
- Provide regular updates on programme progress to the New Vic leadership, Consortium, Board sub-group and New Vic Board
- Supported by the Appetite General Manager, ensure timely delivery of reports to funders and maintain accountability,
- Act as an outward face and spokesperson for Appetite

Lead on artistic programming and community decisionmaking

- Lead on community decision-making alongside the Appetite Supper Club of community curators
- Programme in partnership with local people
- Ensure artistic quality across the reach of the programme
- Develop artistic briefs for open and inclusive artistic programming
- Manage the programming budget
- Build and sustain local, national, and international partnerships
- Liaise with artists to deliver programme objectives

Oversee the effective management of resources to deliver programme objectives:

- Take overall leadership of the Appetite budget (£450.000)
- Supported by the Appetite General Manager, ensure that the programme meets its financial targets and responsibilities
- Meet the income targets agreed for the project
- Work with the Appetite General Manager to initiate new funding streams, including sponsorship
- Attract partnership funding through joint bids and initiatives
- Work with the Appetite General Manager to ensure regular reporting on project finances to the New Vic Managing Director and the Consortium

Develop and implement strategic and project plans

- Lead strategic planning focused on arts delivery, partnerships, engagement, and audience development
- Launch and oversee new projects and initiatives

Lead on partnerships and stakeholder relationships

- Develop and maintain partnerships and stakeholder relationships
- Lead partnership projects for key stakeholders, including the Lead Organisation, where they meet Appetite ambitions
- Act as the key contact for CPP programme funder Arts Council England

Lead on Action Research and Sharing Learning

- Supported by the General Manager, develop and oversee monitoring and evaluation systems
- Ensure that project learning is shared with the wider arts community
- Participate in the CPP Peer Network and other peer learning forums

- Ensure Appetite activities work towards delivery of Arts Council England 'Let's Create' strategy objectives
- Undertake training as appropriate
- · Actively participate in self-evaluation and appraisal
- Advocate for and champion Appetite and the New Vic at events, conferences and similar


